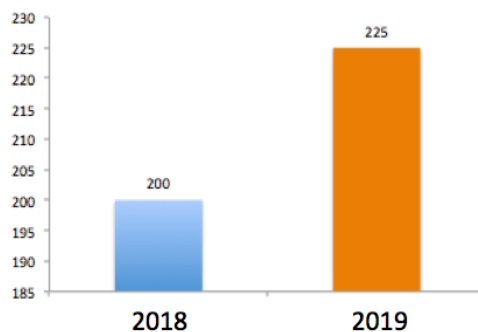


VICE PRESIDENTS / CLUB & MEMBER DEVELOPMENT REPORT

It is with pleasure I present this Vice President / Member Development Report for inclusion in the SLSC 2019 annual report.

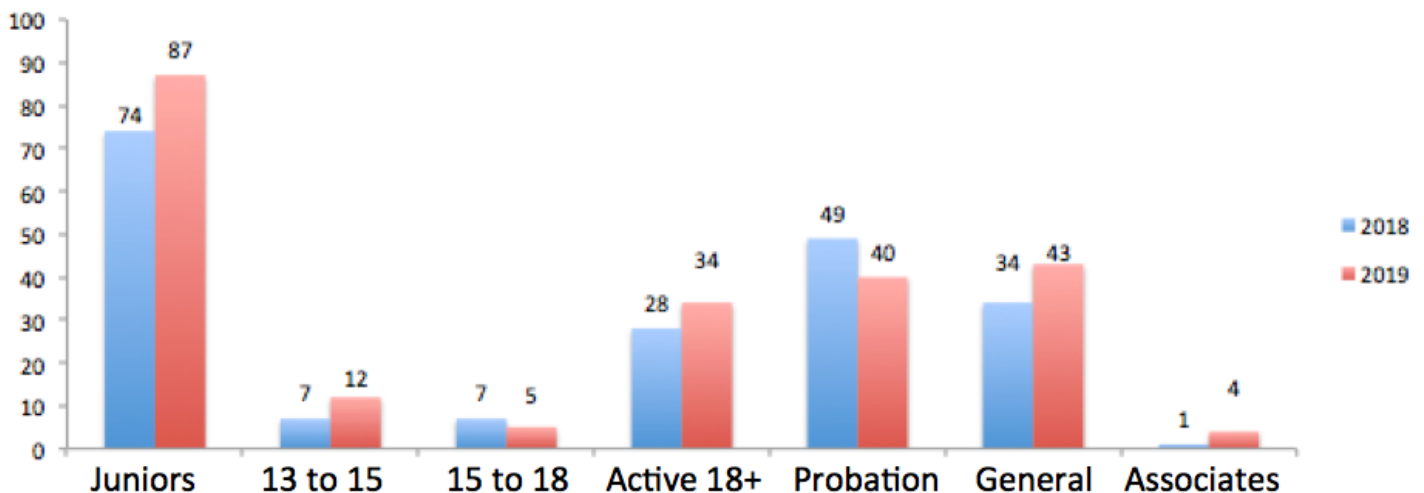
It is an honor to reside on the board of the Seaford Life Saving club and help provide an inclusive, safe, enjoyable and active club ready to perform our core duties of keeping the general public safe on our beaches.

The 2018/19 Season was a strong one for the club with a 12.5% increase in total membership numbers.



The main increase in membership came from our juniors with an 18% increase in numbers from 74 to 87. This includes some of our age groups reaching their maximum capacity. The drive for more age managers and helpers will ensure new members are provided the opportunity to join our great club.

Below is a detailed breakdown of the membership categories compared with the prior year.



It was great to see lots of new families joining our great club with new nippers. This brought a lot of new energy to the club as well as new friends. It would also be fair to say this placed a strain on the new membership process including working with children checks and the like. We got there in the end and from my perspective would like to thank everyone for your assistance and patience during this process.

We have lots of new ideas to help make this smoother in the 2019/20 season. The appointment of a dedicated membership officer will also make this experience better for all.

Other positives from a membership perspective include the increase in the 13 to 15 age group, these young members are now patrolling as SRC members and having a real impact on our patrol groups.

Our 15 to 18 year olds from 2018 have largely moved into the 18+ category and are now solid contributors to patrols and running of the club.

Our patrol teams are healthier than they ever have been with close to 10 members in each of the four teams.

The family bonded club continues to see members move from 5-year-old nippers through to active patrol members.

The morale and spirit of the club is alive and healthy.

My aim as we move into 2019/20 is to ensure all our members have opportunities to grow and develop within the lifesaving environment.

I would like to thank all board members, nippers, nipper parents, SRC's, patrol members and general members for their assistance and support.

LIFESAVING OPERATIONS REPORT

It's with pleasure that I present the Life Saving Operations Report, as Lifesaving Operations Manager for Seaford Life Saving Club.

The past season has shown continued growth with our patrol obligations. Lifesaving Operations is responsible to ensure the club fulfills the State based "Patrol Protocol". We must reach minimum requirement and adhere to all Regulations, Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and Occupational Health and Safety (OHS).

We had a successful patrol season and met our commitments to Life Saving Victoria (LSV). However, we still have the challenge to increase our patrol numbers and key awards to help spread the load across our valued volunteer base.

I would like to thank all volunteers (and family support) that helped us keep Seaford beach safer by offering time to patrol, every patrol hour helps.

Patrol Outcomes/Achievements:

- 2194 volunteer patrol hours
- Full patrols strength ~98% (95% last season)
- 1 rescue recorded (prevention is the plan)
- Beach attendance ~15,606 (during patrol times)
- 31 first aid cases, requiring 2 ambulance call outs
- 322 preventive actions

Keep in mind that it's not about how many rescues that are performed but how many situations we can prevent.

Patrol Equipment Plans:

- Replace ATV in 2019, if successful with VESEP grant, with 1/3 funded by current vehicle trade in.

Our goal is to continue growing the patrol base and encourage new awards to be completed to ensure patrol groups become self-sufficient. The off season is generally when new awards are obtained, so if interested in expanding your award portfolio please contact Berny or your patrol captain.

I'm also pleased not only from a training angle, but for member development, that we have a fifth year in the IRB competition arena. We joined forces with Frankston LSC to make this achievable, as many resources are required for this to occur. The two clubs are working closely together to support the IRB competition event which brings many secondary benefits including - IRB skill enhancement, team building and an opportunity to participate in activities outside of summer (refer to competition managers report for more details).

The Seaford LSC board is committed to our patrol obligations and has shown its support by agreeing to provide and maintain quality lifesaving rescue ready equipment.

My personal thanks goes out to everyone that has provided their voluntary time (and family support) to ensure that Seaford LSC patrol meets the obligations set by LSV and for the support of the Board of Management.

EDUCATION & TRAINING REPORT

Education & Training at Seaford has had a quieter season during summer 2018/19 compared to previous years, but, nonetheless, of the new members we have welcomed to the Club, many have given up their time to learn new skills and join the ever increasing Seaford Life Saving Patrol. Existing members have also made even more room in their lives to train for new awards; all can be proud of the contribution they make to the local community and the support they offer to the Club.

The season kicked off with a Bronze/SRC Course introducing two new Bronzies and seven SRCs; all are now valuable members of Patrol – well done to you all!

Towards the end of the season five Clubs in our area – Aspendale, Carrum, Frankston, Mordialloc and Seaford - joined forces to run a Bronze/SRC course together; each Club hosted and delivered one or two units of the course, giving all candidates a chance to meet and get to know members from other local Clubs and also to experience a variety of trainers and training styles. The course was a great success and gave us another two Bronzies – win win!

In between, Seaford has also delivered an IRB Driver/Crew course boosting Patrol, ensuring full requirements are met.

Members have also attended courses in Silver Medallion Beach Management, First Aid and to become Training Officers.

Once again Seaford Life Saving Club ran its own Skills Maintenance sessions; the weather/water quality was not kind to us at all and Plan A became Plan B, which became Plan C and so on, but in the end all Patrol members succeeded in renewing their Life Saving qualifications – not just Bronze and SRC but also IRB Driver/Crew, Spinal Management and Advanced Resuscitation Technique.

Once again, a huge thank you to all Seaford Life Saving Club members who have given the time (out of already busy lives) to train and volunteer both to improve and help the Club and community in so many ways – your willingness, contribution and dedication are priceless.

We trialled Friday evening sessions that were a hit with parents that appreciated Saturday and Sunday free for other sports, relaxing or just hanging out at the beach. With the introduction of Friday night sessions came a new uniform for our Water Safety volunteers, being a high visibility orange, with matching cap!



We had 2 full sessions called off due to extreme weather forecasts, and 1 session called off mid-way through due to sideways rain and lightning forcing us up off the beach and into the Community Room to wait it out while the snags were being cooked!



We had 5 new and 8 returning Age Managers. Without these volunteers, there would be no Nipper program. So, we thank you all very much for putting up your hand when we needed you. Our Age Managers were in charge of delivering a quality Surf Skills program, leading by example when it came to teaching skills (or being able to find a Patrol member to demonstrate skills)! They asked for respect, showed understanding and patience, allowed their Nippers to have fun and nurtured friendships. Our club welcomes you all back next season to do it all again.

We had lots of Parent Helpers for each age group this year. Grabbing a vest during the session briefing to make sure they could join in on the fun. We had so many helpers, we may need to start a roster next season to make sure no one misses out.

The season saw the inaugural Starfish Nippers program at Seaford. Originally started by volunteers at Anglesea SLSC the Starfish Nipper program is now being run at lifesaving clubs around Australia. The program caters for students with numerous disabilities including Autism, Asperger's and Down Syndrome. Run entirely by volunteers at a number of Life Saving Clubs around Australia, the program ensures that students with disabilities and their parents can be involved with surf skills and lifesaving like their siblings, friends and others on the beach. This program was introduced at Seaford after a parent approached the club, wanting support for her son to continue with us. Luckily, we had the perfect Age Manager for the 1:1 support the Nipper needed. I am so proud of our club, and we look forward to continuing this program in the coming years.
