It is an honor to reside on the board of the Seaford Life Saving club and help provide an inclusive, safe, enjoyable and active club that provides many benefits to society and our local community.

Namely our core duty "to prevent aquatic drowning's"

Other valuable benefits include (but not limited to):-

- Self-Development of membership.
- Surf and Water skills to our nippers and patrolling members.

Once again, the 2021/22 season was largely impacted by the COVID -19 Virus. The lifesaving community including nippers was impacted heavily along with the rest of the community.

- Reduced income from community room hires
- Zero access to the club for general fitness and free time activities.

On a positive our club and members have stepped up to the plate, overcame the everchanging guidelines and provided consistent service to the general public.

I would like to make special mention to our COVID coordinators and their helpers, who have worked tirelessly to keep our club operating and open to support our nippers program and the community

Our patrol teams struggled with numbers this season in general which is on par with the last season.

We are pleased to see a good intake of Bronze and SRC members coming into our teams in the back end of the season.

LIFESAVING OPERATIONS REPORT

It's with pleasure that I present the Life Saving Operations Report, as Lifesaving Operations Manager for Seaford Life Saving Club.

Firstly, a huge thankyou to all for supporting our Clubs Lifesaving activities, made more challenging with Covid 19 restrictions.

The past season has again shown continued growth with meeting our patrol obligations. Lifesaving Operations is responsible to ensure the club fulfills the State based "Patrol Protocol". We must reach minimum requirement and adhere to all Regulations, Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) requirements.

We had a successful patrol season and met our commitments to Life Saving Victoria (LSV). However, we still have the challenge to increase our patrol numbers and key awards to help spread the load across our valued volunteer base.

I would like to thank all our volunteers (and family support) that helped us keep Seaford beach safer by offering time to patrol, every patrol hour helps and is much appreciated.

Patrol Outcomes/Achievements:

- 1564 volunteer patrol hours
- 5 rescues recorded
- Beach attendance ~41,701 (during patrol times)
- Minor First aid cases increased due to jelly fish infestation
- 761 preventive actions

MEMBERSHIP REPORT


The 2021/22 season was a steady one for the club. Despite continued COVID restrictions there was a slight increase in total membership numbers from last year.

2021 - 2022 IRB COMPETITION REPORT

It is with pleasure I present this IRB competition update.

This was the second season post COVID lockdown's and we continued the momentum from the previous 20/21 season.

As per our agreements this season has seen us compete under the banner of Seaford LSC, with Seaford caps on the beach. This is generally rotated every couple of years to be fair to both Seaford and Frankston LSC.

The combined Frankston/Seaford IRB competition team is now into its seventh consecutive season (Excluding lockdowns).

This year saw growth and solidification of team changes made in the prior year. Our woman's team have remained a solid and competitive team, while the men's team had some tweaks throughout the year.

Where possible we included a second Men's team this, this also provided us the opportunity to enter the team's rescue events.

We are very much becoming the go to club for other southern Port Phillip Bay clubs. Both Carrum and Aspendale members are now part of our team and regular contributors.

Our girls team continued to shine throughout the season including States and Aussies (More on that later).

Our Men's team had some consistency challenges, however when they were hot they were hot winning only our second Pennant at Apollo Bay in the Open Men's Rescue.

Our Girls doubled up at States this year winning two Bronze medals at Lorne.




