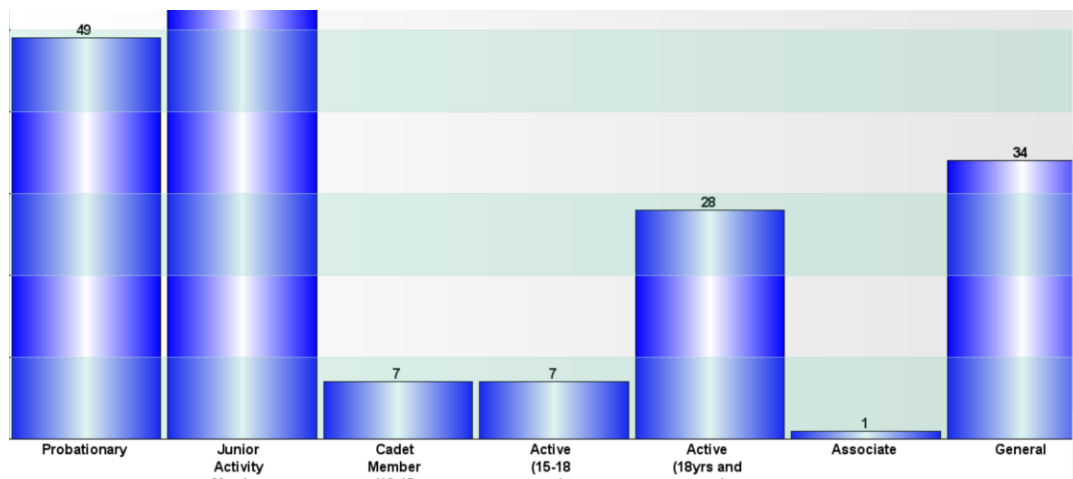
VICE PRESIDENTS / CLUB & MEMBER DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Seaford Life Saving Club has maintained a steady membership again this season. As always, the season started with plenty of interest in the Nippers program and in the club in general. This trend remains positive as membership enquiries are continuing to come in after the season has finished. The membership process requires some adjustment to work more smoothly with the Safeguarding Children legislation. Currently, there is no database we can access to check for Working With Children documents which results in a lag in accepting and processing memberships.

At the end of the season we ended with approximately 200 members and 40 family groups. This highlights the family feel of the club, something we should be very proud of and build on.

The numbers in the Nippers program are growing with some families unable to join due to the large numbers in the younger groups. This is a testament to the Nippers program and the families within our club who encourage other friends and families to join.

Below is a table categorising the member groups in the club for 2017-18.



A big positive to our membership is the number of Nippers (some who started at the age of 5) that have remained with the club and have now become patrol members. This long-term membership reflects the satisfaction with the club and a loyalty that comes with belonging. Our aim should be to retain and value our members while bringing others in to continue to grow and revitalise the club.

Seaford Life Saving Club provides a very important service to the community and introduces younger members to skills and experiences unique to the beach. I hope all members would agree that we are lucky to have this small oasis on the bay to visit, support and help.

LIFESAVING OPERATIONS REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It's with pleasure that I present the Life Saving Operations Report, as Lifesaving Operations Manager for Seaford Life Saving Club.

The past season has shown continued growth with our patrol obligations. Lifesaving Operations is responsible to ensure the club fulfills the State based "Patrol Protocol". We must reach minimum requirement and adhere to all Regulations, Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and Occupational Health and Safety (OHS).

We had a successful patrol season and met our commitments to Life Saving Victoria (LSV). However, we still have the challenge to increase our patrol numbers and key awards to help spread the load across our valued volunteer base.

I would like to thank all volunteers (and family support) that helped us keep Seaford beach safer by offering time to patrol, every patrol hour helps.

Patrol Outcomes/Achievements:

- 2218 volunteer patrol hours, an increase of 318 hours
- Full patrols strength ~95%
- 4 rescues recorded (prevention is the plan)
- Beach attendance ~23,297 (during patrol times)
- 50 first aid cases, an increase of 26
- 856 preventive actions

Keep in mind that it's not about how many rescues that are performed but how many situations we can prevent.

Other Operational Achievements include:

Patrol Equipment Plans:

- Replace ATV in 2019, if successful with VESEP grant, with 1/3 funded by current vehicle trade in.

Our goal is to continue growing the patrol base and encourage new awards to be completed to ensure patrol groups become self-sufficient. The off season is generally when new awards are obtained, so if interested in expanding your award portfolio please contact Berny or your patrol captain.

I’m also pleased not only from a training angle, but for member development, that we have a fourth year in the IRB competition arena. We have again joined forces with Frankston LSC to make this achievable, as many resources are required for this to occur. The two clubs are working closely together to support the IRB competition event which brings many secondary benefits including - IRB skill enhancement, team building and an opportunity to participate in activities outside of summer (refer to competition managers report for more details).

The Seaford LSC board is committed to our patrol obligations and has shown its support by agreeing to provide and maintain quality lifesaving rescue ready equipment.

My personal thanks goes out to everyone that has provided their voluntary time (and family support) to ensure that Seaford LSC patrol meets the obligations set by LSV and for the support of the Board of Management.
