VICE PRESIDENT / CLUB & MEMBER DEVELOPMENT REPORT


It is with pleasure I present this Vice President / Member Development Report for inclusion in the SLSC 2020 annual report.

It is an honor to reside on the board of the Seaford Life Saving club and help provide an inclusive, safe, enjoyable and active club that provides many benefits to society and our local community.


Namely our core duty "to prevent aquatic drowning's" Other valuable benefits include (but not limited to):-

- Self Development of membership.
- Surf and Water skills to our nippers and patrolling members.
- Active exercise and sport opportunities for Junior and senior members.

The 2019/20 Season was another strong year with continued year on year growth. We had a solid 28% increase in total membership numbers.



Once again the main increase in membership came from our juniors with an 31% increase in numbers from 87 to 114. This includes some of our age groups reaching their maximum capacity. The drive for more age managers and helpers will ensure new members are provided the opportunity to join our great club.



Below is a detailed break up of the membership categories compared with the prior 2 years.

It was great to see lots of new families joining our great club with new nippers. This brought a lot of new energy to the club as well as new friends. It would also be fair to say this placed a strain on the new membership process including working with children checks and the like. We got there in the end and from my perspective would like to thank everyone for your assistance and patience during this process.

Other positives from a membership perspective include the continued increase in the 13 to 15 and 15 to 18 age groups, these young members are now patrolling as SRC and Bronze members and having a real impact on our patrol groups.

Our patrol teams are healthier than they ever have been with close to 10 members in each of the four teams.

The family bonded club continues to see members move from 5-year-old nippers through to active patrol members.

The morale and spirit of the club is alive and healthy.

My aim as we move into 2020/21 season is to ensure all our members have opportunities to grow and develop within the lifesaving environment.

I would like to thank all board members, nippers, nipper parents, SRC's, patrol members and general members for their assistance and support.

LIFESAVING OPERATIONS REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen, it is with pleasure that I present the Life Saving Operations Report, as Lifesaving Operations Manager for Seaford Life Saving Club.

Our patrol season has concluded and what a strange year it was, with bushfires and the current coronavirus pandemic in play.

The past season has shown continued growth with meeting our patrol obligations. Lifesaving Operations is responsible to ensure the club fulfills the State based "Patrol Protocol". We must reach minimum requirement and adhere to all Regulations, Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) requirements.

We had a successful patrol season and met our commitments to Life Saving Victoria (LSV). However, we still have the challenge to increase our patrol numbers and key awards to help spread the load across our valued volunteer base.

I would like to thank all our volunteers (and family support) that helped us keep Seaford beach safer by offering time to patrol, every patrol hour helps and is appreciated.

- 1724 volunteer patrol hours
- Full patrols strength ~95% (98% last season)

JUNIOR OPERATIONS REPORT



Planning for Nippers was well underway before the summer of 2019. We were gathering Age Managers and recruiting new ones, making a start on Preliminary Swim Assessments, setting season dates, looking at new ways to engage our Nippers and generally getting the word out into our community about just how fun Nippers at Seaford LSC is !



We had a flood of membership applications which saw us having to put a limit on how many Nippers we could take on for the coming season. A great problem to have! We had a total of 84 Nippers for the season. Our younger age groups were full. This gives us great hope in the future of our club for progression through its ranks for our Nippers to study and train to qualify as Patrol Members.

The Seaford RSL again offered a Sporting Scholarship to Nippers that may need a little extra support to access community sporting activities. We had 18 Nippers granted the scholarship and this provided financial support for their club membership and a bit extra to help with purchasing beach equipment like a beach towel, goggles, sun hat and sunscreen. We hope to have this wonderful act of generosity from the Seaford RSL again to our club in the 2020/21 season.



Our Starfish Nipper program was on the beach again in 2019/20. A wonderful way to support Nippers of all abilities to be included in a program that teachers valuable life lessons in what can be some very challenging situations. I was told how our Starfish Nipper used his knowledge of CPR he learnt at our Nippers during a real-life emergency.

Our first week kicked off on Saturday 7th December 2019. The session was full of new faces, both Nippers and their parents. The Community Room was full of excitement, nerves, sunscreen and rashies. Our new Nippers were decked out in our new design Nippers rashies in fluro green, purchased from RipCurl.



On Saturday 11th January, our Nippers were treated to a presentation from Bin Not Bay:

Bin Not Bay, as part of Marine Mammal Foundation's Marine Environment Litter Program, is designed to inspire appreciation of Port Phillip Bay's amazing marine biodiversity, while highlighting the impact of our litter to encourage action and create long-lasting behaviour change to protect our unique marine life, including the amazing Burrunan dolphin.

It was a great to see the Nippers get into the action by putting on their gloves, grabbing a bag and heading to the beach to collect rubbish! It was a valuable program that offered insight into our bay that not a lot of us previously knew about.



Mother nature certainly threw some interesting weather at us over the planned 13 week program! We had gale force winds, thunder/lightening/sideways rain, poor water quality and poor air quality to contend with.



We managed to squeeze in 2 in-house competition weeks, just enough data to award Age Group Competition winners. These were Round 1 on 8th February and Round 2 on 29th February 2020. The winners will be announced at a time that we can celebrate Nipper achievement and hand out trophies.



Our club and community lost a wonderful volunteer in February 2020 in Peter Phillips. Peter was one of our treasured Age Managers, taking on the youngest group (Under 6/7) to be with his son. His daughter was in an older age group and Pete had supported her through the age groups. His wife supported him and their children by being on the beach as an Age Group helper. The club will be honouring his memory by awarding 'The Peter Phillips Award' at the 2019/20 Junior Presentations for the 'best first year' Nipper.



Our final Nippers session was Saturday 14th March with a fun day on the beach alongside the Patrol Challenge with events including Tug-o-War and the annual Swim Around the Pier. It was wonderful to see some of our more experienced Nippers participate in the Swim Around the Pier. It gave our Nippers a chance to rub shoulders with the uniformed Patrol members, and for our Patrol members to show off their skills!



Our season came to an abrupt end due to Covid-19 and our annual end of season presentation was put on hold. But please don't think that it has been forgotten! The spread sheets have been tallied and our Award recipients noted, with medals in the process of being made and a plan to celebrate 'the season that was' when it is safe to do so.

We do not yet know how the coming season will look, but you can be confident that we are working through plans A to Z to get our Nippers back on the sand. Keep a look out for when our membership application process opens up again and get your paperwork sorted early!

MEMBERSHIP REPORT


The 2019/20 season was a strong one for the club with a 28% increase in total membership numbers.
















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
